**ORDER OF DISMISSAL AS TO JOHN DOES 17 AND 21, ONLY**

The matter is before me on the **Plaintiff's Notice of Settlement and Voluntary Dismissal With Prejudice of Does 17 and 21 Only** [#13]<sup>1</sup> filed April 5, 2012. After reviewing the notice and the file, I conclude that the notice should be approved and that plaintiff's claims against defendants, John Does 17 and 21, should be dismissed with prejudice.

**THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED** as follows:

1. That the **Plaintiff's Notice of Settlement and Voluntary Dismissal With Prejudice of Does 17 and 21 Only** [#13], is **APPROVED**;
2. That plaintiff's claims against defendants, John Does 17 and 21, are **DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE**; and
3. That defendants, John Does 17 and 21, are **DROPPED** as a named parties to this action, and the case caption is amended accordingly.
